Together, the photos tell a story of Tampa Bay's recovery over the past two decades — as shown in clearer water, increased fish and wildlife populations, and expanding recreational use of the bay.

Tampa Bay was designated an "estuary of national significance" by Congress in 1990. The Tampa Bay Estuary Program came into being one year later to assist the region in developing and implementing a comprehensive plan to restore the bay. Today, water quality in most bay segments is as good as it was in the 1950s.

Educational captions complement the beautiful images and help to shed light on the progress made in restoring the bay; the diversity of plant and animal life supported by the bay; and the special connection we feel for the region's signature waterway.

**New "Green" Locomotive Pulls into South Fort Meade**



A new fuel-efficient, environmentally friendly locomotive is now in service at Mosaic's South Fort Meade mine. The "switch-engine technology" used in the ultra-clean N-ViroMotive Gen-Set locomotive produces 80 percent fewer emissions than regular, single-engine diesel locomotives.

The N-ViroMotive locomotive utilizes three engines that can be switched on or off, based on the amount of horsepower needed to pull a 90-car train carrying phosphate rock to Mosaic's crop

nutrient production facilities. Alternating between engines conserves the amount of energy needed to power the locomotive, reducing fuel consumption by more than 50 percent.

Another environmental advantage of the new "green" locomotive is updated idle time technology. Each engine is designed to automatically shut itself down after 15 minutes of idle time, resulting in the 80 percent emission reduction from traditional locomotives.
