## Mosaic Recognized Globally in Annual 100 Best Corporate Citizens List



### Mosaic Announces "Home Runs for Food" Partnership with Feeding America and Tampa Bay Rays

The Mosaic Company will take another step to help feed hungry families in the region with its Home Runs for Food partnership with Feeding America Tampa Bay and the Tampa Bay Rays. Under the three-year commitment, Mosaic will contribute \$500 to the food bank for every home run hit by the Rays during their regular season games. Based on the Rays' historical performance, this commitment will likely lead to annual contributions of more than \$100,000 to Feeding America Tampa Bay.

The Mosaic Company has been recognized in the [Corporate Responsibility Magazine 11th annual 100 Best Corporate Citizens List](#), known as the world's top corporate responsibility ranking based on publicly available information.

Mosaic received its 45th global ranking in part due to its conservation and environmental stewardship as well as its financial and governance transparency. Mosaic's accomplishments include: recycling 95 percent of all water used in its phosphates business, generating nearly 100 percent of its Brazilian power from hydroelectric sources and operating with exceptional openness in financial reporting and governance.

"Mosaic's inclusion in this global best corporate citizen list is the result of the combined efforts of more than 7,000 of our employees worldwide," said Linda Thrasher, Mosaic Vice President of Public Affairs. "Everyone at Mosaic is committed to providing best-in-class performance to our customers and the communities in which we do business. We take this acknowledgement from Corporate Responsibility Magazine as a challenge to raise the bar as we continue operating our business as a responsible corporate leader."

Mosaic's listing is based on more than 360 data points in seven

## Mosaic Dedicates New Florida Headquarters Building



Approximately 400 community leaders, elected officials, employees and other invited guests celebrated the official dedication of Mosaic's new Florida headquarters facility on Friday, April 9th. The 113,000 sq. ft. building in the Circa FishHawk community in southeast Hillsborough County includes the latest in "green" technology and has earned Mosaic a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold certification, the industry standard for measuring a building's sustainability.

After being led in the Pledge of Allegiance by a group of kindergarten students from nearby Stowers Elementary School, onlookers heard inspirational remarks from Florida Governor Charlie Crist, Congressman Adam Putnam, Mosaic President & CEO Jim Prokopanko and Hillsborough County Board of County Commission Chair Ken Hagan.

Among his remarks, Governor Crist recognized Mosaic for its contributions to clean energy production, agriculture and environmental stewardship. "Our economy is built on innovation and the entrepreneurial spirit, and the phosphate industry continues to nourish that spirit," Crist said.

Congressman Putnam emphasized Mosaic's pivotal role in its local communities, and the phosphate industry's role as a pillar of Florida's economy. "In being a part of the future of Florida's economy, it is part of America continuing to the feed the world."

The new facility serves as home to Mosaic's phosphate operations, supply chain and functional support groups, and brings together approximately 400 administrative and

professional employees from several Hillsborough and Polk County locations. In addition to state-of-the-art green technologies, the design focused on creating space to increase collaboration and enhance productivity and teamwork among employees.
